<p><i>As far as you are informed, is the law functional?</i></p>	<p>If the PPP project proposal is incomplete, the Agency warn the public body by issuing a Conclusion and requesting for remedy in a term of 15 days, warning on legal consequences if it fails to do so. If the public body fails to file supplement to documentation within 15 days, the Agency dismiss the PPP project proposal. In practice, the law is functional for now, but there aren't so many PPP projects implemented in Croatia to be able to give a validate review.</p>
<p><i>Is there a specific public body supervising / responsible for the PPP?</i></p>	<p>Yes, there is a Agency for public-private partnership (http://www.ajpp.hr/home-page.aspx)</p>

<p><i>Are you familiar with PPP best practice examples in the field of cultural heritage in your country?</i></p>	<p>The best practice PPP project practice which is now implementing is the project of reconstruction of Croatian historical museum in Zagreb.</p>
